From new play development to writing their own work, Dylan investigates queerness, mental illness, and societal systems through a compassionate and critical lens. They are currently working on

an Untitled Work in Progress which seeks to find a perception of self beyond borderline personality disorder, beyond their trauma, and beyond the cursed crown of codependency through a solo drag cabaret as a part of a residency at La MaMa ETC. In addition, Dylan has worked as a dramaturg on productions at Columbia University, The Brick Theatre, Exponential Festival, La MaMa, and Portland Stage Company.
